<u>Main Points</u>

- **1.** Parents should <u>NOT</u> interefere.
 - ► <u>Stay away</u>.
 - ➤ Do <u>NOT</u> call the school.
 - ➤ Wait for instructions.
 - When parents rush to the scene, they block roadways, emergency vehicles, and first responders.
- School Administrators and Police are united. They have and know the plan. Parents need not worry.
- 3. Do <u>NOT</u> call or text your kids.
 Do <u>NOT</u> engage their texts.
 YOU ARE PUTTING THEIR LIVES
 IN DANGER BY DOING SO!

- If they are texting, they are not paying attention to necessary directions.
- In a lockdown, the chime of a text or the light from the phone can direct a harm-doer right to them.
- Lockdowns mean QUIET and
 DARK. The slightest sound can
 be heard in a quiet school.





- 4. You will receive automated texts/ calls with verified updates and information through an automated system as soon as administrators and police are able.
 - This is done after the incident is under control and it is **SAFE** to do so. If there is a delay, it could be as simple as administrators/law enforcement gathering correct information.
 - Do <u>NOT</u> panic: the school <u>will</u> inform you.

Your child is <u>NOT</u> a reliable source of information.

- 5. Students <u>will</u> be allowed to call parents at an appropriate time.
- 6. What can parents do? Talk with your children at home about their role.Tell them to take it seriously, to pay attention, and <u>NOT</u> to contact you.
